La Dominique's 29 hectares, lying in a prime location in the northwest of Saint-Emilion, bordering the Pomerol appellation, are distinguished by their magnificent terroir. Surrounded by prestigious châteaux like Cheval Blanc, Figeac, La Conseillante, L'Evangile, this Saint-Emilion Grand Cru Classé is an exceptional property which judiciously combines the authenticity of an 18th century residence with the modernity of a new winery, designed by the eminent architect Jean Nouvel.

Growing method : Traditional, cover crops every two rows, according to the vigour of the vine
Pruning : Guyot simple and double
Harvest : Entirely hand-picked.
Merlot, septembre 18 to septembre 30th.
Cabernets, octobre 3rd and 4th
Cellar : Stainless steel tronconic vats, thermo regulated
Average Yield : 47 hl/ha
Blend : 85% merlot - 13% cabernet franc - 2% cabernet sauvignon
