HISTORY

Château Pape Clément is one of the oldest Grands Crus in Bordeaux. It takes its name from Pope Clement V, the archbishop of Bordeaux who was elected pope in 1305. Originally named Bertrand de Goth, it was he who planted the chateau's first vines in the 13th century. The estate can take pride in having produced wine on the same land for over seven centuries.

GROWING SEASON



*Winter: Warm and wet.

Spring: Chilly and rainy with some frost.

Summer : Chilly and wet.

70% Sauvignon Blanc 30% Sémillon

VINEYARD MANAGEMENT

- Micro-plot management.
- Controlled grass cover, animal-drawn ploughing under the vines.
- Sustainable pest and disease management.
- Lateral shoot removal and leaf thinning.
- Manual harvest in two rounds of selective picking.



WINEMAKING

- Manual filling of the pneumatic press.
- Whole-cluster pressing, increasing the pressure very slowly in an inert atmosphere to preserve the aromas.
- Gravity-flow of the press juices into barrels.
- Settling and vinification in French oak barrels and foudres.
- Ageing on fine lees and regular stirring.
