Cherry paste and red licorice notes show a frame of nicely toasty vanilla, with just enough flesh to push through on the herb-tinged finish, imparting a touch more depth than most of its peers in 2013. Drink now through 2017. Tasted twice, with consistent notes. 5,800 cases made.—J.M.

Score : 16 +

59% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot, 21% Petit Verdot.

Clear crimson. Very blackcurrant and green pepper mouthful of hedge. Some ashy cigar. There is some really pretty dark blackcurrant fruit that bravely pops its head up at the start and then dives for cover somewhere, glimpses of it, but the tannins take over the palate like a battalion of Sherman tanks and pretty much everything gets flattened at the moment. Trench warfare in a bottle, but I think the fruit is confident enough to win through. (TC)

Wine Advocate

Score 86-88

A major sleeper of the vintage, this excellent estate has turned out a dark ruby-colored 2013 exhibiting notes of black currants, licorice, spice, roasted herb, lead pencil shavings and forest floor. The sweet mid-palate and light tannin suggest it should be consumed over the next 5-6 years.

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
