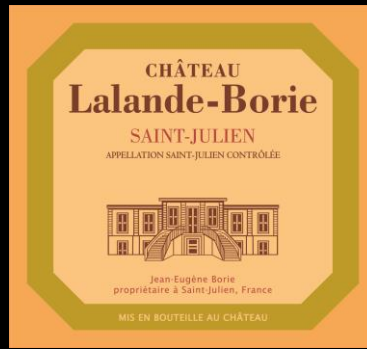

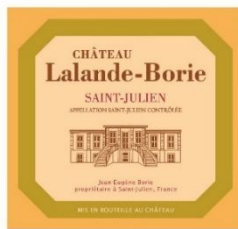

Château Lalande-Borie 2017

The story:

Château Lalande-Borie was created by Jean-Eugène BORIE in 1970. It occupies thirty hectares, of which twenty-five are vineyards, on the western plateau of Saint Julien, alongside some of the greatest classified growths of the appellation.

Cellar Master Tasting Notes (March 2018):

Color : deep garnet

Nose : fruity attack followed by red fruit aromas

Palate : generous structure, a spherical wine, great charm, fine finish. Very seductive.

From now on, a wine in its own right, with its own identity, subtle and with style.

Meteorology:

Winter was cold and dry, spring has been totally the opposite, hot and rainy.

In April, the tendency changes again with an alarming lack of rain and hot temperatures. A serious period of frost (April 27, 28 and 29) caused damage according to the terroir.

The summer was rainy at times but overall dry.

The vintage was early but at the end of a fine and dry summer the September rains give a new life to the vines, completing the ripening of the grapes.

The grapes harvested had perfect technological ripeness and very high phenolic potential, because of the previous three months climatic conditions.

The blend:

- **66 %** Merlot Noir
- **34 %** Cabernet-Sauvignon

Our commitment:

The sample shown was taken from the definitive selection carried out in the first quarter of 2018.

*This Lalande-Borie 2017 will be aged for **12 months** in Bordeaux barrels, **30% new**, the rest in barrels which have been used for only 12 months.*

Barrels of certified French oak, naturally dried outdoors, for a guaranteed minimum of three years.

Regular topping up during the first six months, rackings every two or three months for a total of four rackings.

Sterile bottling under inert gas. Natural 49 mm corks.

Bruno Borie mentioned that there was a little frost on the western part of Saint-Julien here. A blend of 66% Merlot and 34% Cabernet Sauvignon, the medium garnet-purple colored 2017 Lalande-Borie has a beautiful nose of red roses, dusty soil and powdered cinnamon with a core of red currants, black cherries and kirsch plus a touch of warm plums. The palate is medium-bodied with a chewy frame and lively backbone supporting the muscular fruit, finishing savory and with great persistence. To be aged for 12 months in barrel, in one-third new oak.

2017 EN PRIMEUR

Château Lalande-Borie (Saint-Julien - from the Ducru-Beaucaillou portfolio)

(66 Cabernet Sauvignon, 34 Merlot) | 30% new oak for 12 months. | 13.36% alc. | 70 IPT

This wine was hit hard by the frost, losing 50% of the crop. Interestingly, this is a very well balanced wine and they were forced to harvest Cabernet a few days early on account of rain. Had they waited, they would have lost the freshness but gained maturity and this would have been a shame because rain has, seemingly, helped this wine. The tannins are a little dry, but this will allow the wine to mature at an even pace. **16.5+**

Château Lalande-Borie 2017: This is the third Bruno Borie wine in the appellation, made from vineyards which sit to the west of the Ducru-Beaucaillou and Le Croix de Beaucaillou vines. There was a little frost here, but only first-generation fruit was picked for this *cuvée*. The picking dates here are the same, starting on September 18th. The alcohol is 13.36%, the total acidity 3.37 g/l and the IPT is 70. The blend is led by Merlot, at 66% of the total, the other 34% all Cabernet Sauvignon. While Merlot dominance is atypical for the second wine, here the blend is quite typical. There is an attractive, dusty, perfumed fruit-rich character here, to this very typical blend. I find the same fruit-led character on the palate, with plush blackcurrant and damson fruit, and a sooty, black olive underlay. It has medium-grained tannins, lovely substance and fresh acidity. This is quite delicious, showing substance and grip, with a nicely chalky tannic backbone to the finish. It will drink very well in 5-10 years time. 91-93/100 🔍

Deep crimson. Lifted cherry fruit overlaid with oak sweetness. Juicy fruit with just a slight bitterness as if the extraction was slightly hard, but nice fruit in the middle. Really juicy on the finish and the tannins are fine and add to the length. Good freshness. (JH)

50% frost here, but the wine seems remarkably unscathed. They harvested the second generation fruit, but didn't use it in the blend, which is in fact the same as usual but just in lesser quantities. The result is a soft but well-rounded and finessed wine with black cherry fruit and charcoal and vanilla bean notes. A good job here - an early drinking pleasure. 3.75pH. 30% new oak.

From the terrific team at Ducru-Beaucaillou, the 2017 Château Lalande-Borie checks in as a blend of 66% Merlot and 34% Cabernet Sauvignon brought up in 30% new oak. It's not a powerhouse, with medium body and moderate concentration, yet it's impeccably balanced and will keep for a over a decade.
