I was also extremely conscious of the man who represents the third Léoville, Anthony Barton of Chx Léoville Barton and Langoa Barton. On my last day in Bordeaux I had the enormous pleasure of lunch at Langoa with Anthony's wife, daughter and winemaking granddaughter – Eva, Lilian and Mélanie respectively – and enjoyed two great wines (Léoville Barton 1986 and Langoa Barton 1982) chosen by Anthony, who wasn't feeling 100% that day. Mélanie, incidentally, is making wine at Ch Mauvesin-Barton, their new property in Moulis that is surely following the family tradition of offering real value.

Exceptionally dark purple. Very meaty, concentrated nose with real lift. Lots of graphite and grit. No spare flesh but truly terroir wine. Sinewy. Bone-dry finish. Very much in its own style. But long and precise.

2016 St. Julien Bordeaux Tasting Notes, Ratings for all the Best Wines

Located in the middle of a ménage à trois, **St. Julien** is sandwiched between the power, elegance and classic, tannic, stoicism of **Pauillac** to the north, and the feminine, floral refinement of **Margaux** to the south. Its unique geographical location, giving it access to the Gironde, as well as the gravel slopes and plateaus was exactly what was needed to produce such stunning 2016 St. Julien wines.

2016 St. Julien is a perfect vintage. Or if you think this is hyperbole, I can change that to almost perfect. Every vineyard in this appellation made prodigious wine.

2016 **Langoa Barton** – Bursts of tangy little currants, a cedar wood fire sends out smoke plumes of cassis scented tobacco into a damp forest, leading you to a polished, fresh, bright, crisp and crunchy blast of red berries. The finish offers length and lift in a classic style. From a blend of 55% Cabernet Sauvignon, 37% Merlot and 8% Cabernet Franc, the wine reached 13% alcohol. The harvest took place from September 20 to October 13. 91 – 93 Pts

The 2016 Langoa Barton is a blend of 55% Cabernet Sauvignon, 37% Merlot and 8% Cabernet Franc picked between 29 September and 13 October. It is being matured in 60% new oak barrels. It has a very succinct bouquet, with a mixture of black and red fruit, a slight sea spray/estuarine tincture, hints of leather and brown spice in the background. The palate is very harmonious on the entry with a grainy texture. There is good backbone here, maybe just a little foursquare compared to other Saint Julien wines, but it gathers pace towards the finish that displays touches of spice and cedar. Understated and classic Langoa.
