

The story:

This Grande Réserve is produced on the portion of Ducru-Beaucaillou situated in-land, in the heart of the Saint Julien Appellation, on the Günz Terroir situated on the south slope that face the "Mouline" stream. Our labors in the vineyards, as well as those in the vat-house and cellars, reflect our unequivocal ambition to produce the very finest wines.

Cellar Master Tasting Notes (March 2018):

Color: deep crimson violet

Nose: powerful, taut, with hints of black fruit and plums

Palate: imposing structure, with great freshness, hint of very polished tannin, attractive elegance, very sound.

The blend:

58 % Merlot Noir

• 39 % Cabernet-Sauvignon

• 3 % Petit Verdot

Meteorology:

Winter was cold and dry, spring has been totally the opposite, hot and rainy.

In April, the tendency changes again with an alarming lack of rain and hot temperatures. A serious period of frost (April 27,28 and 29) caused damage according to the terroir: the terroirs of Beaucaillou, located just above the estuary, were once again (cf. 21 April 1991) spared from a a particularly biting cold (-5°C in St. Laurent). The summer was rainy at times but overall dry.

The vintage was early but at the end of a fine and dry summer the September rains give a new life to the vines, completing the ripening of the grapes

The grapes harvested had perfect technicological ripeness and very high phenolic potential, because of the previous three months climatic conditions.

Our commitment:

The sample shown was taken from the final selection carried out in the first quarter of 2018.

This Grande Réserve 2017 will be aged for **12 months** in Bordeaux barrels, **60% new**, the rest in barrels which have been used for only 12 months.

The barrels are of certificed French oak, aged naturally outdoors for a guarantee minimum of three years.

Regular topping up during the first six months, rackings from the bottom of the barrel every two or three months for a total of four rackings.

Sterile bottling under inert gas. First choice natural corks 49 mm.

Drinking window:

The 2017 La Croix Ducru-Beaucaillou is loaded with dark stone fruit, grilled herb, lavender and torrefaction notes. Powerful and dense, with serious richness, La Croix is anything but an easygoing second wine. In 2017 La Croix is built on a core of Merlot rather than Cabernet, which likely accounts for the wine's rich mid-palate and fleshy feel. The blend is 58% Merlot, 39% Cabernet Sauvignon and 3% Petit Verdot.

This is not a second wine per se, as it consistently comes from a separate vineyard in Saint-Julien. The blend is usually around 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, but this year it has a high percentage of Merlot: 58%, with 39% Cabernet Sauvignon and 3% Petit Verdot. Medium to deep garnet-purple colored, the 2017 La Croix de Beaucaillou has quite a spicy nose sporting cloves, anise, black pepper and fenugreek with a core of crushed blackberries and black currants plus wafts of underbrush and potpourri. The palate is medium-bodied with firm, grainy tannins and great freshness supporting the vivacious fruit, finishing long and earthy.

The 2017 La Croix de Beaucaillou sees 60% new oak for 12 months, with a fairly high IPT of 75. It has a ripe and generous bouquet of blackberry, fresh fig, cedar and crushed violets that blossom in the glass. The palate is medium-bodied with supple tannin, a fine bead of acidity, that structure making its presence felt towards the finish that exerts an insistent grip. As such, this will probably require three or four years in bottle just to soften the edges.

La Croix Ducru-Beaucaillou 2017: This second wine comes largely from vines just inland of those that feed into the estate's *grand vin*, and the picking dates are the same. In this vintage it also includes a little Merlot that was declassified from the *grand vin* vineyards. During the sorting Bruno Borie says he and his team eliminated less Merlot than Cabernet Sauvignon, to my surprise, and this combined with the addition of the declassified fruit means the blend is Merlot-rich this year. Alongside 58% Merlot there is 39% Cabernet Sauvignon and 3% Petit Verdot, when Cabernet Sauvignon would usually dominate this *cuvée*. The alcohol is 13.68%, total acidity 3.46 g/l and the IPT 75. It has a dark and smoky nose of black olive and black raspberry. The palate shows a lovely broad and supple character, with great freshness, but also a surging backbone of ripe, polished, velvety and concentrated tannins. The overall effect is bold and substantial. This is an impressive second wine, ripe and energetic, with deliciously silky-velvety tannins. Very good indeed. 92-94/100

Deep crimson. Again that scented cherry fruit that I tasted in Lalande Borie with just a hint of char. Savoury as well as sweet-fruited – definite red fruit on the silky mid palate. Firmer on the finish but lots of fruit in the middle and a long, juicy, fresh finish. Fine tannins and just a hint of chocolate-sweet tannins on the finish.

The Merlot here is grown on sandy-gravel soils and brings both freshness and structure. There's good balance, plush autumnal berry fruits and lovely spice, supported by well placed, delicate tannins. It's a clear Médoc twist on the varietal, even though this is a little lusher and more approachable than in recent years where Cabernet Sauvignon has been higher in the blend - last year it was at 66%, but vintage conditions in 2017 affected some of the crop. It's a little different in expression from 2016, but is an extremely high quality, great drinking wine. 3.74pH. IPT 75.

A blend of 58% Merlot, 39% Cabernet Sauvignon, and 3% Petit Verdot, 60% new oak, the deep ruby-colored 2017 La Croix Ducru-Beaucaillou from the charismatic winemaker Bruno Borie is another elegant, seamless wine from this vintage. It's certainly a high-quality second wine. (It's more like a second cuvée as it comes from a designated sector of vines.) Crème de cassis, crushed flowers, violets, and forest floor notes all flow to a medium-bodied, silky 2017 that has fine, fine tannin and plenty of length. Drink it while you wait on the Grand Vin.



2017 La Croix Ducru-Beaucaillou – Dried flowers, cocoa, plums, cherry and cassis create a wine that's fruity and fresh, sweet and round and light on its feet. The finish of licorice and ripe, red berries is easy to like and already delicious to drink. From a blend of 58% Cabernet Sauvignon, 39% Merlot and 3% Petit Verdot, the wine reached 13.68% alcohol and is aging in 60% new, French oak barrels.
