Château Citran 2021 Haut Médoc



Château Citran is one of the oldest estates in the Médoc. The Donissan de Citran family reigned over ^w this former Médoc seigneury from the 13th century until 1832.

n 1996, the Merlaut family, already deeply involved in the Bordeaux wine industry, took over the beautiful estate. Today, Citran has over 80 hectares of vines in the Haut-Médoc appellation. These are planted with premium grape varieties that make the most of its fine terroir: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot.

A healthy balance between traditional and modern techniques prevails in both the vineyard and cellars to produce a very elegant and distinguished wine.
