Haut Médoc



Château Citran is one of the oldest estates in the Médoc. The Donissan de Citran family reigned over this former Médoc seigneurie from the 13th century until 1832.

In 1996, the Merlaut family, already deeply involved in the Bordeaux wine industry, took over the beautiful estate. Today, Citran has over 80 hectares of vines in the Haut-Médoc appellation. These are planted with premium grape varieties that make the most of its fine terroir: Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, and Cabernet Franc and Petit Verdot.

A healthy balance between traditional and modern techniques prevails in both the vineyard and cellars to produce a very elegant and distinguished wine.



TASTING NOTE

Color

Purple rim, limpid

Nose

A complex and highly appealing black fruit.

Palate

This entry is very elegant, fine and racey. The palate is long and powerful. It is very fresh and onctuous in the mouth.

Finish

Plenty of substance in the finish with good tannic and aromatic length. This is a wine with plenty of expression.

- Traditionnal vinifications
- Malolactic fermentations partially made in new barrels
- 35% of new barrels in French oak
- Traditionnal ageing with racking every three months
- Fining with white eggs
- Bottling at the Château
