


Château La Motte

History

The history of Château La Motte dates back to the 15th century when it belonged to René De Dreux. The property was sold in 1498 to Mathurin De Polignac, and then to Jean-Paul Chevalier. It was only in the 18th century that the estate was sold to Gabriel Regnault de la Mothe. At his death, he left his property to his nephew Isle de Beauchaine.

Château La Motte is an old fortress dating back to the Middle Ages. Marie-Caroline De Bourbon, Duchess of Berry, stayed in this former feudal castle before being imprisoned by order of King Louis-Philippe in the citadel of Blaye. Château La Motte joined the Valet family with Michel Valet, who then sold it to his two sons in 2016. Today, the property is owned by Xavier Valet

Tasting

The Château La Motte's robe is bright and garnet, its nose has aromas of ripe fruit. The palate is fleshy with hints of ripe berries with a lot of freshness. The acidity is nice. Everything is balanced, sweet and round. This wine is to be drunk young over the next 3 to 5 years.
