


Château Petit Bouquey 2010

St Emilion Grand Cru



This familial estate has been entirely renovated these past years, under the supervision of the owner Eric BORDRON (4th generation). This passionate man is well surrounded thanks to the advice of his oenologist Stéphane TOUTONDJI (Château Fonroque, Roquebrune etc.) The value of this wine maker is the production of modern wines, while respecting the vintage and the terroir. The estate produces a Saint Emilion quality as well as a "premium" quality arising from the best plots in Saint Emilion Grand Cru.

The cellar has all the latest equipment's: modern stainless steel vats for parcel fermentations. The harvest arrives directly by gravity in the vats preventing the use of pumps that crush the grapes and bring air to the wine.

Bordeaux Tradition

The merlot present at 87% in the wine has a major role in the final taste of the wine: the nose and the mouth are very fruity with slight kicks of spices. Round and well balanced, this wine is a gem.
