SAINT-EMILION GRAND CRU CLASSÉ

DATE SHEET

Surface area: 6,82 hectares, on one single piece of land

Geographic position: Eastern, Southern and South-western slopes of the Saint-Emilion hill and plateau

Soils: clay-limestone

Plantation density: 6000 to 7500 vines per hectare

Grape Varieties: 100% Merlot,

Average age of the vines: 40 years old

Vine growing: vines are grown traditionnally and a proportion of rows are grassed down; de-budding is carried out, followed by green harvests.

Harvest: picked by hand

œnologists: Hubert de Boüard de Laforest
and Emmanuelle d'Aligny-Fulchi

Winery: wooden, concrete and stainless steel vats, all equipped with temperature control.

Fermentation on skins: 2 to 3 weeks

Wines go into barrels: straight after they have been run-off

Annual production : approximately 20 000 bottles

Maturation: 16 to 20 months

Bottling: at the estate
