

# Cos d'Estournel

- A complex terroir in the northern Médoc, along the Cironde estuary and close to the Atlantic Ocean, that benefits from constant ventilation.
- Thanks to their deep roots and ability to adapt, the vines of Cos d'Estournel Blanc yielded a graceful wine.
- Sauvignon Blanc grapes were concentrated but lively, and Sémillon were highly mineral thanks to their limestone terroir.
- Remarkable energy accompanies a rich, precise palette of aromas, resulting in an accomplished, fascinating wine with great cellaring potential.
